# Toledo gives back to City of Hope

The Folga golf group, established by Joe Toledo of Chino to share friendships and to raise funds for City of Hope cancer research, will hold its club championship Sunday at Los Serranos South. A more generous bunch you'll never see.

Here's what I mean. Golf will be followed by dinner at Central Basco Restaurant in Chino, where Toledo and Folga members will present their 2008 donation of \$3,800 to City of Hope director Joann Lang.

Through the years, Folga players, teeing it up in 12 outings annually, have donated more than \$35,000 to the City of Hope and funded 40 scholarships to honor Toledo's father, Antonio.

City of Hope holds a special place for Toledo whose mother, Juliana, underwent successful surgery in 1984 at the City of Hope to remove a cancerous tumor from her left lung.

"They treated my mom wonderfully," Toledo said. "Ever since then, I've done everything I could to donate to the City of Hope."

This year's championship will go to the player with the lowest net score. "George Madruga of Cerritos is our defending champ," Toledo said Tuesday. Three low indexers in the field of 29, featured in the final foursome, are expected to battle for low gross honors.
